MADISON AND EDUCATION IN AMERICA

New York, NY—When **William J. Bennett** served the Nation as its Secretary of Education, he endeavored to enhance secondary school curriculums by proposing one that he thought most appropriate. Interestingly, he chose to name it (See http://www.eric.ed.gov/ERICDocs/data/ericdocs2sql/content_storage_01/0000019b/80/1c/0d/37.pdf) in honor of Madison. It is no accident that across the Nation, many communities make a similar tribute by naming their schools for Madison since, among all the Founding Fathers, he was among the first to acknowledge that an educated public would be a key to the success of the Nation's government.

Visiting the AFM website one can quickly find links to many of the high schools across the Nation that are named for Madison. Although the act of naming a school reflects a particular set of values of those managing such schools, it is interesting to observe the apparent fall-out. Even the school named for Madison in this city's borough of Brooklyn has an inordinate number of graduates who have chosen to use their education on behalf of the Nation including two current U.S. Senators (**Bernard Sanders** and **Charles Schumer**) and one U.S. Supreme Court Justice (**Ruth Joan Bader Ginsburg**).

A CALL TO ACTION: Shifts in Attitudes and Passage of Years Impacting Madison's Historic Standings per Recent Poll

Washington, D.C.—In conjunction with the recent transition to Barack Obama from George W. Bush, following a practice that dates back to at least 1948 when Harvard historian **Arthur M. Schlesinger, Sr.** conducted a similar analysis, CSPAN has released a new poll ranking the success of individuals who have been President.

In their most serious forms, these polls have sought to elicit a greater understanding of Presidents by endeavoring to weigh their achievements and leadership against their failures and faults to obtain a comparative consensus. To the *cognoscenti* and the *partisan*, Madison—of course—ought to stand among the greatest and historically he has actually always achieved a strong showing in such polls despite their tendency to quickly deteriorate into something of a popularity contest.

Out of sight and out of mind quickly lead to aberrations in results just as the opposite tends to elevate one's rating.

Eighth now 20th?

Madison has traditionally ranked among the top 10 but over the past 60 years has increasingly faced contention for his spot from heightened publicity for the Adams family and recent Presidents who are more easily known by survey participants. Recent Presidents who have caused Madison to shift from his top ten spot include Truman, Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson, Reagan and Clinton. If a Bush "Chronicle" appears, Madison could face a further shift.
